

Accommodation Information

While the Condé Nast College does not arrange accommodation on behalf of students, we have compiled a list of housing options for students studying in London. Please note these are suggestions not recommendations, and we encourage students to thoroughly research the numerous accommodation options and providers in London.

The two most popular housing options for students studying in London are student accommodation services or privately rented flats. Taking into account the duration of your course, your budget, commute and familiarity with London, it is up to you to decide the most suitable option.

Suggested student accommodation

There are plenty of living options in London. Below is a list of student accommodation providers, serviced apartments and short-term letting companies. Though there are other options available, these are the largest providers that usually have availability.

To apply for student accommodation services, you will need to book at least one month in advance to ensure you obtain a room. You will be required to send a copy of your passport, a letter from the College stating your acceptance onto the course (unconditional acceptance letter), and sometimes a bank statement.

Letting agencies and estate agents

Some students who study in London (usually those on longer courses) opt for privately rented flats. Arranging this type of accommodation is usually best done in person as you should always inspect a property to ensure its suitability, and the landlords/agents rarely make commitments to unseen tenants. If you choose to live in private accommodation you should arrange to come to London before the beginning of your course.

Letting agencies and estate agents are private businesses used by landlords to advertise and often manage their property. Agencies are a good way to find properties quickly, however most charge a fee once they have found your

accommodation. It is best to inquire about an agency's fees prior to registering with an agency, so you know what to expect.
